

#### Introduction

- Voter turnout among young Americans is dismal
- 20-30 percentage points lower than among older citizens.




• These levels may not reflect lack of civic mindedness, but rather may be the consequence of a combination of institutional and motivational obstacles that get in the way of people participating in politics.


#### Data and Methods

- Conduct qualitative interviews with NC civic teachers about problem
- Survey NC high schools to assess current civic programming
  - 40% Response rate (235/581 schools)
- Conduct in-class voter registration and preregistration drives with Wake
  County Public School System (WCPSS)


