Session 1: What is a successful research proposal?

What makes a proposal likely to get funded? Why are some proposals unlikely to get funded? We will look at proposals from prior years that got funded and that didn't.

We will begin by discussing the strengths and weaknesses of two or three proposals submitted by volunteers.
